Overall Purpose

The post will support the delivery of the UKRI-funded Responsible AI UK Keystone research project "PROBabLE Futures - Probabilistic AI Systems in Law Enforcement Futures", undertaking personal and collaborative quantitative and qualitative research activity as required by the project, contribute ideas, and/or enhancement of techniques or methodologies, writing up research work for publication and dissemination, to contribute to impact across all work packages and to transfer of knowledge/learning lessons from other domains and Responsible AI UK projects.

The post will also contribute to projects that both directly contribute to the University's research strategy, with a focus on research that delivers impact. The post holder will work with external stakeholders and it is expected that their work will have an impact on local/national policy and practice in the area of expertise in participatory research, ethics and governance and Al.

The post-holder will publish high-quality research papers. The post holder will be responsible for managing research funding bids (specifically UKRI-funded Responsible AI UK Keystone research project "PROBabLE Futures - Probabilistic AI Systems in Law Enforcement Futures"), securing future funding to expand research, and they will also promote the university's research outputs/agenda to partners and international audiences.

Principal Duties and Responsibilities

- Work as a key member of a team, leading projects as appropriate
- Contribute to and on occasion lead bids for funded research, enterprise and consulting projects
- Identifying research opportunities
- Carry out and/or oversee the delivery of specified and agreed research tasks
- Liaise with research councils, commercial research partners and other external funding bodies as required
- Analyse and evaluate outcomes of research projects
- Develop modes for dissemination of outcomes
- Write and publish papers and technical project reports
- Contribute to workshops, conferences and other dissemination events
- Prepare and develop teaching and learning materials as appropriate
- Undertake a range of knowledge transfer and enterprise activities as appropriate
- Develop links with external organisations and to contribute to partner and funder engagement activities. In particular, there is an expectation that the post holder engage with RAI UK sandpit research projects and other group activities.

- The post holder will be expected to undertake other responsibilities and tasks as reasonably requested by the line manager. The post holder will be line managed by a Research Leader and ultimately be accountable to the ISII Director and the Executive Dean for Research.
